DKMS – who are we and what do we do



Every 20 minutes, someone in the UK is diagnosed with blood cancer. DKMS as a charity is committed to helping patients with blood cancer or blood related disorders, providing second chances at life to those in need of a transplant, and raising funds to cover donor registration costs.



Each patient who needs a stem cell transplant requires a genetic 'match' with a potential donor. This can be like finding a needle in a haystack, which is why we need as many people as possible on the register.



We aim to register more donors, especially younger people, as potential lifesavers- individuals who are willing to donate their stem cells to a stranger.



If you are a match for someone, the donation process is usually very similar to donating blood platelets.
